#### What in the World is Wisconsin Wins?

Wisconsin Wins:

- ♦ A program to prevent youth access to retail Tobacco Products
- An opportunity for adults and teens to work together to make communities healthier
- ♦ A program designed to reward retailers for doing the right thing and NOT selling tobacco to teens
- Initiatives include retailer education and training, media outreach, and community education

The Wisconsin Wins Program was introduced in 2001 by the state's Health Department in an attempt to decrease access of tobacco products to minors. It is estimated that over 90% of tobacco users begin well before the legal age of 18. As cigarette smoking rates have dropped over the last few years, the tobacco industry has created new products to keep users hooked and to find new customers. These "other tobacco products" (OTPs) are harmful and addictive, plus are marketed aggressively and priced inexpensively.

Another new product to be concerned about is the E-Cigarette or Electronic Nicotine Delivery System (ENDS). These, like OTPs come in candy and fruit flavors making them especially appealing to young people. The flavors and new products may attract young people and are often perceived as being less harmful than cigarettes.

Marquette County Health Department through the 5 Counties for Tobacco Free Living Coalition, is contracted to conduct tobacco compliance checks every year with the goal to help keep youth access down. The health department is always looking for young people ages 16 and 17 to help with these checks. Incentives are given. If you, or


