



Upham Woods History Part 1- Open Enrollment

On August 22, 1941, Elizabeth Upham Davis and Caroline Upham Keene gifted Upham Woods to the University of Wisconsin Board of Regents for the price of \$1. The 310 acres of land along the Wisconsin River, north of Wisconsin Dells, included Blackhawk Island, and was to be used as an outdoor area to help teach youth. While the first 4-H conservation camp was held in 1935, the land was known forever as Camp Upham Woods, starting 75 years ago in 1941.

"These lands are to be used as an outdoor laboratory and camp for youth, such as 4-H clubs and other people cooperating with the University of Wisconsin in the advancement of conservation, of agriculture and rural culture." -The Upham Sisters.

This mission still resonates today, as Upham Woods continues to produce high quality education for youth participating in 4-H, school trips, scouts, youth retreats, and conferences. The Upham Sisters goals helped shape Upham Woods, and we would like to

announce a chance for more 4-H youth to experience camp this summer.

Registration is now open in <u>4-H Online</u> for Open Enrollment Camp here at Upham Woods, July 15th-18th! 

Upham Woods History Part 2: Ranger Mac

Upham Woods' interactive history series continues as we move closer to our 75th anniversary on September 18, 2016. Make sure to check out our <u>Website</u> and <u>Facebook</u> for more information. This installment focuses on Wakelin "Ranger Mac" McNeel, who helped establish Wisconsin's elementary conservation curriculum, along with being the first superintendent of Upham Woods Outdoor Learning Center.

Ranger Mac Cabin

Ranger Mac grew up in Kilbourn, now Wisconsin Dells, where he spent much of his childhood enjoying the wonder's of the outdoors around him. His upbringing led him to become a renowned educator, teaching at Black River Falls High School in Tomah and teaching science to students in the education curriculum at Whitewater Normal School before being named superintendent of the Fort Atkinson School District in 1912.

The University of Wisconsin-Madison hired McNeel as a professor of agriculture and a forestry extension agent after working for Marathon county 4-h where he promoted youth nature activities. His love for the outdoors led him to help create conservation curriculum, that he broadcasted through his radio program 'Afield with Ranger Mac' which won a National Peabody Award. His program reached close to 700,000 youth during the 30's, 40's and 50's. Listeners viewed him as a Wisconsin Environmental Hero, along with John Muir and Aldo Leopold.

McNeel's passion also led him to Upham Woods, where his influential role helped establish the camp, and he became the 1st superintendent from 1941 to 1956. For 15 years Ranger Mac helped the camp thrive, purchasing 8.7 acres of land from the Brew family, known today as Cabin Hill. In 1954, Columbia County Friends Of Wakelin McNeel presented Upham Woods with Ranger Mac Cabin, where you can still stay in today!
