

Background Check & Enrollment Updates for Adult Volunteers - 2017 Fall Enrollment



Dear Leaders,

September, 2017



As general leaders, project & activity leaders or key leaders, your role is important for enrollment and re-enrollment to be successful for both youth members and adults. There have been some updates in the reenrollment process, mainly for adult volunteers, so please read carefully.

This year the State 4-H Office will be running all remaining re-enrolling volunteers who have not done a national criminal background check (through the company GIS). We are doing this to be in compliance with University policies. We appreciate your support over the past two years in which we have already completed 5,000 national background checks. We will continue national background checks on a four year rotation for all volunteers.

There are some things that will be helpful as adult volunteers are enrolling. **Background Checks:** All background checks for new and returning adult volunteers will be conducted at enrollment time.

All volunteers need to enter on the screening page an email address they check regularly. This should be a different email address for each volunteer. This email address will be used for your background check and is very important for the background checks to run smoothly.

Re-enrolling Volunteers: All reenrolling volunteers who have not completed a National Criminal Background Check will need to do this **before** their re-enrollment can be approved.

- Volunteers will enroll in 4HOnline in the areas they will be volunteering.
- Volunteers will receive two emails, one from UW-Extension with information about the background check and one from General Information Services (GIS) the vendor who conducts the background checks. The link in the GIS email is only active for 5 days. Please check your junk or trash email boxes as well.

New Volunteers: In addition to the Background Check, all new volunteers will need to complete the Volunteer in Preparation Training (VIP) and Mandated Reporter Training **before** their enrollment can be approved.

Volunteer Hours for Adult Leaders:

When asked in the re-enrollment screens, all volunteers are encouraged to record the number of volunteer hours they provided last year as a volunteer leader. This helps us tell a story about the impact volunteers make here in our county and statewide.

Thank you again for your work as volunteers at the club and county level. Your work is valued and appreciated. Let us know if you have any questions about enrollment this fall.

Wisconsin Pork Association Scholarships

Wisconsin Pork Association Scholarship

The Wisconsin Pork Association scholarship is open to high school seniors pursuing post high school education in agriculture. Preference will be given to those students possessing leadership abilities and a sincere interest in the swine industry. Five finalists will be selected from the applications received to compete for the \$500 scholarship, with each finalist



receiving \$250 for their participation. An interviewing committee will select finalists. The application for this scholarship is posted on www.wppa.org.

Whitmore Memorial Scholarship

The Whitmore Memorial Scholarship was established as a legacy to the late Rex Whitmore, a master statesman and communicator who served as the first executive director of the Wisconsin Pork Producers Association.

Applicants must be a registered junior or senior at one of the following University of Wisconsin campuses: Madison, Platteville, or River Falls. This is a \$500 scholarship, and priority will be given to applicants pursuing an Animal Science or closely related major, with each finalist receiving \$250 for their participation.

The criteria considerations include grade point average (applicant should be in top one-third of class), extracurricular activities involvement and leadership positions, career interest and orientation, and financial need. The application for this scholarship is available from each respective campus' contact person listed on the WPA website.

Gunderson Memorial Scholarship

The Wisconsin Pork Association, in cooperation with the family of Buell Gunderson, established a scholarship program in 2007 to recognize the many contributions that Buell Gunderson made to the Wisconsin pork industry. As swine herdsman for the University of Wisconsin-Madison for more than 30 years, Buell Gunderson was instrumental in helping shape not only the swine industry, but also hundreds of 4-H and FFA youth and university students through his teaching, judging, coaching and commitment. In addition, Gunderson, together with his wife, Bernice, served as Secretary/Treasurer of the Wisconsin Pork Association for 20 plus years and assisted in growing the organization from its initial roots to the successful organization that it is today--sponsoring scholarships, developing youth programs and helping to support the pork producers of the state.

The Wisconsin Pork Association will accept recommendations or applications from county pork producer organizations, industry members, pork producers, and colleges or technical schools for recipients of the Gunderson Memorial Scholarship on an annual basis. Individuals who have shown considerable dedication and involvement in the pork industry will be considered for the \$500 scholarship.

Accident Insurance

Just a reminder that part of the member dues you pay to be in 4-H goes towards accident insurance during 4-H events and meetings. Enrolled 4-H members and registered Leaders are covered for accident insurance. The events that are covered are planned 4-H group events/meetings with adult supervision. Meetings/ events need to be on the club, project, or county calendar or in club minutes. Two people is not a group (for instance - one project leader and one member) and therefore is not covered by the accident insurance. If you are in a club situation where you have only one member and leader in a project, please contact a club near you to work together or do the project work at a monthly club meeting when there are more people involved. Please keep this in mind for the safety of all our members and leaders. Also, remember that non 4-H members are not covered by 4-H accident insurance. Clubs need to take out special activity insurance for club events where there will be non 4-H members participating in order for non 4-H members to be covered by the 4-H insurance.

As a reminder, any meetings held on personal property are primarily covered by personal home owners insurance, and 4-H Leaders transporting youth in their personal vehicles are assuming primary coverage under their personal auto insurance. This is why it is a good idea to hold meetings at public locations, which also usually are accessible to all members. This is also why it is a good idea to have families transport their own family members.
