What: Livestock Bowl is a quiz competition where all the questions are about beef, sheep, swine, and meat goat topics and students use a buzzer in order to answer the questions. Teams compete in a double elimination format by giving oral answers to questions posed by a moderator. Each match has both an individual and toss-up question round. The winning 4-H senior team will represent Wisconsin at the National 4-H Livestock Quiz Bowl

competition in Omaha, NE at the **AKSARBEN** Livestock Exhibition. Skillathon contest is made up of a written quiz and learning stations such as breed identification, feed identification, equipment identification as well as some team activities such as demonstrating evaluation skills. The top Senior level 4-H team will represent Wisconsin at the National 4-H Skillathon Contest, held each fall in Louisville at **the North American International Livestock Exposition (NAILE)**. Competition in Quiz Bowl & Skillathon encourages members to develop a more complete knowledge of animals and related subjects. This contest provides an educational program for all project members, including those who may not own a project animal, and provides a way to develop self-confidence. These programs are a great parallel to some similar programs that breed associations and other organizations conduct.

CLUB OFFICER ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES President:

- Plan the business part of the meetings with other officers and volunteer leaders.
- Know and follow parliamentary procedure to conduct an orderly 4-H club meeting.
- Call the meeting to order and direct the business meeting.
- Provide opportunities for all club members to be heard. Get everyone to participate.

Vice-President:

- Preside at meetings in the absence of the president.
- Know parliamentary procedure so that you can conduct an orderly 4-H club meeting.
- Know the duties of the president.
- Work closely with the president, leaders, and other officers on all club activities.
- Help plan 4-H club programs.

Secretary:

- Keep an accurate record of the proceedings of all meetings.
- Conduct roll call at the request of the president and record attendance.
- Stand and read minutes of the last meeting when the president calls for them. Make corrections to minutes as presented by 4-H members of the club.
- Read correspondence received by the 4-H club and send any correspondence as directed by the club.

Treasurer:

- Keep accurate records of all the money taken in and paid out by the 4-H club.
- Make deposits of money to the bank; write checks requested by the 4-H club, and pay bills authorized by the club.
- Give a report of money received, bills paid, and amount on hand at each 4-H club meeting.

Reporter:

- Write a report of each 4-H meeting and submit it to the UW-Extension office for publishing in the Clover Clipper.
- Write articles about special 4-H events and club news for your local newspaper.

Caller:

• Contact 4-H members to remind them of upcoming 4-H club meetings and events.

Camp Counselor Training at Upham Woods. Mark your calendars!



The Wisconsin State Fair Dairy Promotion Board is offering \$1,000 scholarships to students that will be third or fourth year college students during the 2019-20 academic year.

Any Wisconsin resident who is currently enrolled as a full-time student at a four-year Wisconsin school and is pursuing a dairy-related or food science degree is eligible for scholarship consideration.

PREVIOUS RECIPIENTS ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO APPLY.

All applicants are required to submit an application electronically as a PDF no later than MARCH 22, 2019. Save application as LAST NAME, FIRST NAME and e-mail to <u>katzman@idcnet.com</u> using the subject – Wisconsin State Fair Dairy Promotion Board Scholarship Application. Attach your transcript as a separate document. HAND-WRITTEN APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. MAILED APPLICATIONS/TRANSCRIPTS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

Applicants will be evaluated on involvement and leadership in dairy-related activities, scholastic achievement and career objectives. The scholarship committee will select finalists from the eligible applications received. Finalists will be interviewed, with the recipients to be recognized at both the Dairyland Youth Celebration and Blue Ribbon Dairy Products Auction during the 2019 Wisconsin State Fair. Please note that in order for continued consideration, students selected for an interview must be available during normal business hours on the interview date.

Scholarship recipients must continue enrollment in the suggested curriculum and maintain an overall GPA of 2.5 or higher or forfeit scholarship monies. Scholarships will be awarded at the completion of the first semester and at the time the Wisconsin State Fair Dairy Promotion Board has received a copy of registration for the second semester and a current transcript.
